SCRAP STASH CUTTING DIMENSIONS

Large pieces of paper, start with the **biggest measurements** and work down from there.

$4-1/4 \times 5-1/2$

This will fully cover the card front for an A2 card. Use this layer to hide ribbon, brad prongs, and any other things you want hidden. This is generally card stock.

$4 \times 5 - 1/4$

This, generally, will be the design paper or embossed paper that will be nested atop the $4-1/4 \times 5-1/2$. This can be card stock or design paper.

After you have made the biggest cuts to your paper, the remnants of that piece will be cut to the following dimensions. As far down as the paper will allow. These cuts will be done on both card stock and design paper. Also, for the stray papers that have been cut in half or more, these dimensions are used.

The following cuts will be for borders, or narrow pieces that will span the width of the card front. Side opening cards, these cuts will be used near the fold. For bottom opening cards, these cuts will be used near the fold or at the bottom. Both card stock and design paper are good for these cuts.
